Students:

A Level Digital Photography was introduced into our curriculum in September 2013, and has become a well-established department with outstanding academic achievement and student progression rates. We currently have 109 students on the A Level course and 14 on the AS Level. In terms of profile, a substantial number of students who study Photography A Level take it to complement their other creative subjects such as Fashion, Design, Art and Design, or Media. However, others study A Level Photography within a predominantly science or humanities programme. The quality of work students produce is of an exceptionally high standard in content and presentation, and students enjoy being part of a creative, forward thinking department.

Staff:

The department team comprises a full time Head of Photography, a part-time teacher and a full time Photography Technician.

Department/Facilities:

The Photography course is very well resourced, with a dedicated Photography classroom running high spec PCs and Adobe Creative Cloud packages, Nikon DSLR Cameras, and a professional range of photographic equipment. High quality print facilities, up to A1 size, are also available. There is a dedicated photographic studio, as well as access to a dark room facility for B&W photography, supported by Nikon SLR film cameras. The department is situated in alongside the Media and Film Department, and the departments share an office.

Additional information:

The successful applicant would be expected to teach across all areas of A Level Photography. Above all, the appointed candidate should be an enthusiastic and committed teacher of Photography with a strong portfolio of practical, technical and creative skills. The ideal candidate will be proactive in approach, uphold high expectations of themselves and students, and enjoy collaborating in a team.

College Hours:

College teaching periods start at 8.55 am and end at 4.15 pm. Each teaching period is 65 minutes. The department regularly runs after-College studio workshops, which are well attended by students.

Salary: Salary will be up to £48,355 per annum (pro rata) inclusive of fringe area allowance. This is a substantial part time role.
