WHAT **ISTUDY?**

We have over 40 A Levels and Vocational Courses to choose from and virtually any combination of course is possible for your study programme.

How do I decide?

Don't choose a subject because you think it is what employers will want or because it is a subject to fall back on.

Instead, ask yourself these FIVE questions:

- **1.** What subjects do you enjoy?
- What subjects are you good at?
- **3.** *Is there a new subject that your school doesn't offer?*
- **4.** What type of learning do you enjoy? Exams or Coursework?
- **5.** Do you have a specific degree, job, or industry in mind? Find out what their requirements are.

What's the difference between **A Levels** and a **Vocational Course**?

A Levels are two-year exam-based courses and the traditional route to university and beyond. A Levels are graded A* to E. If you're not sure what career you want to do, studying a selection of A Levels is a great way of keeping your options open.

Vocational Courses, such as BTECs or AAQs, are more practical, skills-based courses where you learn through coursework or themed units. These are excellent preparation for specialist degree courses. They are also nationally recognised qualifications and a credible alternative to A Levels.



What is an extension study?

At Esher, you get to choose an extra activity to your timetable that allows you to extend your learning beyond the classroom. These activities are not examined. The majority include one period per week on your timetable. There is a variety of creative, scientific, social sciences or life skill courses to choose from, as well as the option to join one of our competitive sports' teams.


Why do I need to do one?

Universities and employers are increasingly interested in the wider skills and abilities you will learn in these activities, such as teamwork, problem solving, thinking critically (or creatively), and the ability to carry out independent research.

How do I choose?

In August 2025 when you enrol, you will be able to select one Complementary Study on your timetable alongside your chosen academic subjects. There are more than 40 options on offer. You can check out what's available on the Extension Studies page of our website.

In your second year, you will choose a **Progression Pathway**, which is designed to complement core A Level and/or Vocational Courses. There are a range of pathways available that may include gualifications (e.g. Further Maths AS Level), specialised career or performance development courses (e.g. L2 Award Introduction to Counselling), or to complete an Extended Project Qualification (EPQ).

We offer support for all kinds of learners. Check out our programme of academic extension courses available to help you aim high.

Stepping up to Sixth Form

Many students find it's a big step up from GCSEs to A Levels and Vocational Courses, which is why we work with you from the start to develop the skills you need to make the transition successful.

During your first few weeks at College, your subject teachers will run course induction sessions, highlighting our **Learning to Learn** programme, to help you develop the study skills you need to succeed on higher-level courses.

Aiming High

If you are predicted mostly 7s, 8s and 9s in your GCSEs, you can build your own extension studies programme to suit your desired academic pathway. High Achieving students can take an extra extension study and choose two courses tailored to their interests each term. This is in addition to joining a specialist academic pathway programme such as our **Oxbridge Programme or Medics, Vets and Dentists Programme**.



Sparking your Curiosity

All departments provide **Subject-based Support**, which is designed to deepen your thinking and broaden your knowledge. High-achieving students have the opportunity to work on more demanding issues and problems.

If you are studying STEM subjects, you will be able to enrich your learning through participation in national Olympiads and the UK Mathematics Trust Challenge.

If you are more of a Humanities kind of thinker, we bring in visiting speakers, MPs, and authors to challenge your thinking.

Our Creative Arts department offers comprehensive extension study options including College Band, Choir and College Production and there is support for students preparing for auditions to prestigious institutions and courses such as Bird College and Rambert.

Supervised Academic Study

All students will have one timetabled period a week for Supervised Academic Study (SAS). These SAS periods teach you how to use your study time more effectively. You can learn strategies and access resources such as short courses in note-taking, essay writing or revision strategies to help you become an independent learner.

Private Study Periods

One of the biggest differences at sixth form will be the amount of private study periods you have. Learning to study independently is a key skill for life and how you use this time is up to you. Many students find our Learning Resource Centres and our Study Centre are the perfect environments for quiet study and research. Other students prefer studying in the café, outside in the quad or even at home.

LEARNING SUPPORT

Our Learning Support team works across the College to ensure that the individual learning needs of all students are identified and met.

How do I tell the College about my learning needs?

When applying to the College, we strongly encourage you to disclose all information about your learning needs on your online application form. You will have the opportunity to discuss your needs at your course interview (between November and April) and again at enrolment (August), where you may be asked to do an initial assessment to establish current levels of need.

How will you help me with my transition to College?

All students who have disclosed an Access Arrangement will have a timetabled supervised study lesson in our purposebuilt Study Centre. In the first half-term, you will also have a session with a Learning Mentor about your needs, and your student profile will be updated about how teachers can support you.

Transition to a college environment for students with Education, Health, and Care Plans (EHCPs) may require additional support. This is carefully managed over time with Local Authority liaison, to encourage independence, rather than dependence on support. Some students may be invited to attend acclimatisation days to aid the transition process, meeting key staff, who will become familiar faces.

What support will I get?

We have a team of Learning Mentors based in the Study Centre, which offers a quiet environment where targeted support and advice around any learning related issues can be accessed. Students who access regular support from the Study Centre can also use it as a quiet space to complete work.

Some students may also have weekly timetabled, one-to-one sessions with their allocated Learning Mentor.

The Learning Support Department also receives referrals from teaching staff where there are concerns that a student may have barriers to learning. In these cases, an onward referral can be made for one-to-one support, and/or a screening assessment to ascertain whether there is sufficient evidence to provide an exam Access Arrangement.

Student Services

HEALTH AND WELLBEING SERVICES

Student health and wellbeing forms the foundation of a student's ability to access learning. The College has a dedicated Student Welfare Team, who have established links to external mental health services and other organisations. The College also has a team of on-site counsellors who offer a six-week course of one-to-one sessions.

STUDENT FINANCE

The Bursary Fund provides financial support for students from low-income families. The fund is assessed against eligibility criteria and is paid weekly (subject to attendance) into the student's bank account. Another great thing about studying at Esher is our on-site facilities.

Around campus There are many green spaces for quiet study or to relax with friends. We also have two Costa Coffee concessions, a snack shack, and our vibrant café area, which provides a variety of tasty meals.

Sport facilities In addition to our Sports Hall and student gym, we have a 3G AstroTurf pitch, a rugby pitch, a grass 9v9 football pitch and newly refurbished netball and tennis courts.

In the classroom We have specialist, state-of-the-art facilities for every subject.

Specialist software including Adobe Creative Cloud suite, SOLIDWORKS 3D CAD, Logic Pro X, Sibelius, and Microsoft Visual Studio.

IT Services All students have access to high-speed WIFI throughout the College and Microsoft 365 with access to Microsoft Teams, Word, Excel, PowerPoint, Outlook, OneDrive and so much more.

Private Study

We have two Learning Resource Centres and a purpose-built Study Centre, which provide the perfect environments to support independent study and research.

LRC1 has an extensive library of 25,000+ books, as well as journals, textbooks, magazines, photocopiers, stationery shop and 116 PCs available for quiet and silent individual study. LRC2 is a supervised area for large group study and has 42 PCs. Both areas are supported by a team of friendly library assistants to help you with research, to borrow equipment or to access our comprehensive e-resources and subscription databases such as Massolit.

Our **LapSafe Locker** scheme offers a hassle-free solution for students who may have forgotten their laptops. We have 192 laptops housed in lockers for you to use exclusively on campus.

Need a computer?

We have 780 desktop computers, 294 laptops (including 192 in the LapSafe Lockers scheme) and a suite of 32 Macs. Specialist Music building with two recording studios, six practice rooms and a suite of Macs

HOW DO I APPLY?

All applications are made online via our Online Applicant Portal at **esher.ac.uk**

Will I get a place?

If you are a Guaranteed Applicant, you will automatically receive a place once you have submitted your application.

If you are an Open Applicant, you will be allocated a place using a ballot system held on Wednesday 2 October 2024 and emailed after 3pm. Once available places have been filled, a number of Open Applicants will be placed on a reserve list and any remaining applications may be unsuccessful.

Entry requirements

The minimum entry requirement is five GCSEs at Grade 4-9, but some courses may require you to get higher grades. It is important to get at least a Grade 4 in English Language and Maths. The absence of a GCSE Grade 4 in English Language will significantly restrict your study programme options. Please see
